Douglas G. Stewart is President and Chief Executive Officer of Marts&Lundy. He has chaired more than 35 "Development for Deans" conferences for the Council for Advancement and Support of Education (CASE) and has conducted development training programs for dozens of organizations throughout the U.S. and Canada.
